



Be The Church: Do You Understand What You Are Reading? Acts 8:26-40

WORSHIP

Consider reading **Psalm 129** together, taking turns reading a verse a time, or reading responsively with the leader reading a verse and the group responding with the next verse.

Consider singing some of the songs on the sheets that were included in your packet if you have someone in the group that plays the guitar or can lead music and/or play the guitar.

WELCOME

Questions.

Have you ever had the moment the you felt you needed to share the Gospel to someone else? What did you do? Share to the group what had happened.

WORD

Discussion Questions.

1. Discuss your individual learning from the life of Philip which talks about his.....:
 - a) Genuine Faithful Obedience;
 - b) Clear Identity with Christ;
 - c) Faithful in small and big things;
 - d) Faithfulness in proclaiming the Gospel;
 - e) Dependence in the Holy Spirit.
2. Read Luke 24:13-33 (The road to Emmaus). Compare and discuss the similarities of this event with the encounter of Philip and the Eunuch. What does this tell us about the Spirit of God.

3. “Often times, full knowledge and understanding only begins at the point of obedience.” Share your individual experiences regarding this realisation.
4. God often calls people into uncertain situations. Why do you think is the reason for this? Has the Lord ever called you to something uncertain? How does this impact your relationship with Him?
5. We will see that one of the very evident traits of Philip is his genuine faithful obedience to the Lord’s leading. In our personal walk with God, what normally prevents us from responding the way Philip did every time that He has called us into something unsure and uncertain. Please share your past experiences just as well as your present struggles regarding obedience.
6. In light of our study today, how is God speaking to you in the area of faith, commitment and obedience . (at home, in the church, at work, etc). Site specific examples.

WORK

There may be a “eunuch” around you (maybe a friend, a relative or an officemate) who is in need of knowing the Savior. Prayerfully ask for the leading of the Holy Spirit so you can share Jesus to him or her.

Close your time together in prayer.
